## **Microsoft Office Live Meeting to Lync**

Microsoft introduced Lync 18 months ago as their new flagship collaboration tool. Essentially a combination of Live Meeting and Office Communicator, Lync is designed to be a single source for enterprise level communication – online chat, VoIP, and collaboration all thru a single client. Reducing the number of communication channels will be a welcome addition for companies struggling to manage and integrate numerous tools. Teams will find this to be a more effective communication tool -- view status, chat, share documents and instantly meet and collaborate online. All necessary tools in running a successful business in today's world.

However to achieve this single solution for all methods of collaboration, Microsoft has made a decision to restrict the functionality of Lync, due to the high support costs associated with Live Meeting functionality. Starting spring of 2012, Microsoft will begin the process of converting all current licenses of Live Meeting to Lync, with the goal of sun setting Live Meeting in June of 2014. Microsoft knows for businesses that currently use Live Meeting for things such as E-Learning, training, registration, and shared video, Lync will not work. In these situations Microsoft has made a strategic decision to partner with companies like V2.
